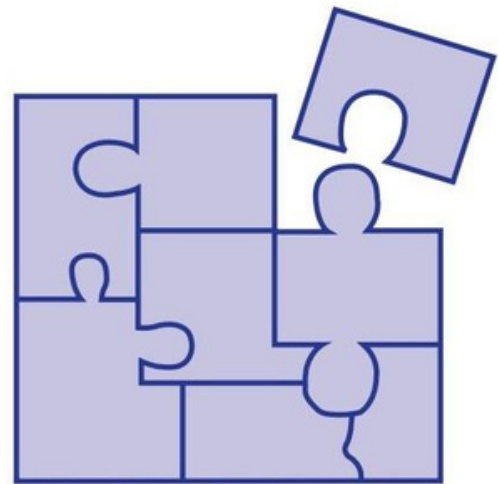

## International Day of Persons with Disabilities

International Day of Persons with Disabilities is celebrated on December 3rd of each year with the aim of promoting the empowerment of persons with disabilities (PWDs) and bringing awareness to the challenges faced.

### Theme for 2022

According to the United Nations, the theme for 2022 is "Transformative solutions for inclusive development: the role of innovation in fueling an accessible and equitable world."

Furthermore, it was noted that in times of crisis PWDs are excluded and left behind. Therefore, the central premise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development is that no one is left behind. This includes governments, public and private sectors coming together to create accessibility and equality for PWDs.

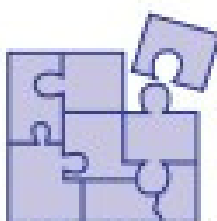

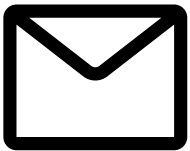
