Disability Awareness

International Epilepsy Day

International Epilepsy Day is observed each year on the 2nd Monday of February. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), this day is dedicated to raising awareness and advocating for persons with epilepsy.

What is Epilepsy?

Epilepsy is a chronic noncommunicable disease of the brain characterized by recurrent seizures (WHO, 2023.)

Focusing on epilepsy in Trinidad and Tobago, the Seizure Awareness Foundation of TT (SAFTT) hosted a Seizure Conference (Greaves, 2018). At this event, neurophysiologist Dr Wendell Bobb estimated that 40,000 persons in Trinidad and Tobago could be living with seizures.

He also recommended the following do's and don'ts when assisting someone who is having a seizure:

Do's

- Lower them to the ground.
- Turn them on the side to help open the airway.
- Remove any glasses.
- Remove anything that is tight around the neck.
- Put something soft under the head
- Call the ambulance if it is the person's first seizure or if the seizure has lasted for five minutes or more

Dont's

- Do not put anything into their mouth
- Do not try to stop them from shaking as it can cause further injuries.
- Do not try to give them CPR. Towards the end of the seizure, persons may stop breathing for a while and appear as apneic. This may cause persons to become worried and attempt to administer CPR.




